

MAINE'S TEEN DRIVER SAFETY COMMITTEE

In Maine, about 17,000 16-17 year olds have a driver's license. One in five of those teens will be involved in a crash this year.

The Maine Teen Driver Safety Committee, convened in 2009, is comprised of individuals representing public safety, transportation, motor vehicles, health and human services, and public and private organizations. A major component of the Committee's work was the development of a statewide teen driver safety strategic plan. The Plan and the objectives and activities it contains are intended to be used as a resource in a larger comprehensive community based effort to effectively address teen driver safety issues.

Strong community leaders and stakeholders partnership is critical in order to be successful. The Teen Driver Safety Committee is available to provide support and technical assistance as requested.
